



# 2010 Summer Schedule

Registration Opens Saturday, May 1st

Kids have been spending time outdoors and making new friends at Pal Camp for over 50 years. Pal Camp includes many traditional camp activities such as arts & crafts, games, singing camp songs, cooking, swimming, hiking, water games, scavenger hunts, and storytelling on the sleepover night.

Pal Camp is located in a beautiful redwood grove on Freshwater Creek, just 15 minutes from Arcata or Eureka. Our staff provide a friendly, safe and comfortable atmosphere where youth can discover and enjoy the great outdoors, while creating memories to last a lifetime.

Camp sessions are one week long and run from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily, with the exception of Thursdays. On Thursdays, camp runs from 1:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. with a family potluck at 6:00 p.m., followed by fun skits and an optional sleepover for youth entering fourth grade and above. Extension hours are available beginning at 8:30 a.m. and ending at 5:30 p.m. for \$4/hr.

Each camp session costs \$150 per child. There is a \$10 discount per session for campers who attend additional week sessions. Free t-shirt for all campers! **Campers ages 5-12. Teen Counselor positions available. Limited scholarships available.**

## **Session 1: June 21 - 25: Global Explorations**

An international week of activities and games reflecting a variety of world cultures. Special foods, and unique guests to engage campers in a tour around the world without using their passports.

## **Session 2: June 28 - July 2: Let's See What's Cooking**

Work with your camp group to design a dish for all to taste at the end of the week. Become an iron chef as you design a recipe, try out your cooking skills, and then have your fellow campers taste test your creation. What fantasy dish will your group decide to make?

## **Session 3: July 12 - 16: Eat or Be Eaten: Surviving the Wild**

Learn animal tracking and how to explore the woods as an orienteer. Learn cool stuff about edible plants. Cook over an open fire and become skilled in the art of survival. Shelter construction and survival gear essentials will all be a part of this fun week for your camper.

## **Session 4: July 19 - 23: Circus Carnival**

Jugglers, magicians, and clowns are just a few of the guests who will be there to help with costumes, hats, music and theater for Pal Camp's Carnival! Relay races, games, and face painting are just a few of the activities in this week of excitement.

## **Session 5: July 26 - 30: Humboldt Safari: It's a Jungle Out There**

Discover the wildlife of Humboldt with hands-on activities, visiting animals, and wildlife of the Freshwater Creek watershed. Explore insects and track animals.

## **Session 6: August 2 - 6: Arts & Music in the Forest**

Campers will design and learn how to create natural masterpieces from the environment around them. Projects include tie-dye and musical instrument making. Visiting musicians will enrich camper experiences.

## **Session 7: August 9 - 13: Mad Scientists**

Come ready to experiment with bubbling potions & slippery slime. Create volcanoes and other wild science experiments while learning about renewable resources. Cook in a solar oven and discover how science is fun!
